CENTENARY DECLARATION A commitment to shape a better future of work

- Adopted by the Centenary Labour Conference (June 2019)
- Recognizes the transformational changes in world of work
- Calls for a human-centred approach to the future of work
- Reaffirms the ILO's social justice mandate.
- Provides guidance for the ILO's priorities and programme.
- Represents a crucial call to action for the ILO and its member States.

A human-centred approach puts workers' rights and the needs, aspirations and rights of all people at the heart of economic, social and environmental policies.




CENTENARY DECLARATION A human-centred approach

- Increasing investment in the institutions of work, and
- Increasing investment in decent and sustainable work.

- Strong tripartite constituents and influential and inclusive social dialogue.
- International labour standards and authoritative and effective supervision.
- Economic, social and environmental transitions.
- Sustainable enterprises for generating decent work.
- Skills and lifelong learning.
- Gender equality and equal opportunities for all.
- Adequate and effective protection at work for.
- Comprehensive and sustainable social protection for all.

- Ensure adequate protection for all workers.
