The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment (Finnish: työ- ja elinkeinoministeriö) is a ministry of the government of Finland. The ministry's task is to build an operating environment and to ensure productivity, growth, high levels of employment and well-being.

The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment has three ministers: the Minister of Economic Affairs, the Minister of Employment and the Minister of the Environment, Energy and Housing.

The ministry manages local employment and economy offices, local Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment and a host of separate national agencies.
