**III APPLICATION OF THE ARTICLES IN FINLAND****Minors**

According to the Finnish Immigration Service (incl. The Assistance system), labour exploitation of minors has not been identified as a problem in Finland. Minors admitted to the Assistance system for victims of trafficking in human beings who have been victims of labour exploitation have been exploited outside Finland. They are typically unaccompanied minors seeking asylum in Finland who have been identified as victims of human trafficking in the asylum process by the Finnish Immigration Service's asylum unit, by the staff of reception centres (juvenile units) or by an assistant and referred to the assistance system.
